Training:

Bernedoodles are among the easiest dog breeds when it comes to training because they inherit trainability from both parents, especially the Poodle... the Bernese Mountain Dog can be stubborn at times.

When it comes to training the Bernedoodle, we will recommend you to keep each training session short and varied so that your dog will not be bored easily.

You will need to consider some essential training like potty training, housebreaking, obedience training, and fundamental commands necessary in getting the dog to respond to you.
